A lot of things need to happen to put the finishing touches on that project.

"Yale Road has had quite a few problems with utilities, survey issues and other things not expected," Allen said. "But paving begins (this) week and if we get a couple weeks of good weather we should be done by December."

Allen also said with a hand-full of winter construction already started, the District 4 residencies won't be done with the 2007 season for a while.

Current projects include a rehab to the Ridgeway Road I-84 overpass, new traffic signal in Twin Falls and U.S. 26 junction with Avonmore Road.
